1. You cannot put your own registration plates on a pre-owned/used vehicle without providing a Safety S Certificate which certifies a vehicle's fitness. It is valid for days.
2. If you are selling your used vehicle privately, you must buy a Used Vehicle I Package to be shown to potential buyers.
3. Automobile insurance is C in Ontario. You must insure your vehicle for third party L for at least \$200,000.
4. It is illegal to drive a vehicle in dangerous condition. If your vehicle is found to be U, it will be taken off the road until the problem is fixed.
5. If you have been drinking and are involved in a C, your insurance company may not have to pay for D to your vehicle and your M costs may not be covered.
6. It is illegal to your licence; or to use and licence; or to use another licence as your own. You cannot have more than Ontario driver's licence.
7. The D Point/System encourages drivers to improve their driving behaviour and protects people from drivers who abuse the P of driving.
8. Broken lines that are wider and closer together than regular broken lines are called C lines. On your left side they mean the lane you are in is E or exiting and you must change lanes to continue in your current direction.
9. Yellow lines separate traffic moving in O directions whereas white lines separate traffic moving in the same D.
10. A pedestrian facing a F or steady H symbol should not begin to cross the road.
11. W Signs indicate dangerous or unusual conditions. They are diamond-shaped with a Y background with black letters or symbols.
12. Traffic signs give you important information about the law. They use different symbols, C and shapes for easy identification.
13. In case of a C, it must be reported to the police when there are injuries or damages to vehicles or property exceeding \$.
14. Switch to low beam headlights within metres of an oncoming vehicle or when following a vehicle within metres.

16. Do not park within 3 metres of a fire H; within 100 metres of a B; within 15 metres of a controlled intersection with L or within 15 metres of a level railway C.
17. You may drive on the right shoulder to pass a left-turning vehicle only if the shoulder is P.
18. After passing a vehicle, change lanes only after you have seen the F of the overtaken vehicle in your rearview mirror and have C over your right shoulder.
19. You do not have to wear a S while backing up.
20. At pedestrian crossings never pass A vehicle within metres of the crossover.
21. Letting another vehicle go first in traffic is known as Y the R.
22. Controlled intersections use T lights, S signs or Y signs to control traffic.
23. Where there are no posted speed limits, the maximum speed is km/h in built-up areas and km/h elsewhere.
24. Whenever following another vehicle, leave enough S to stop S if the other vehicle brakes suddenly.
25. Turn on headlights one-half hour before S and keep them on until one-half hour after S.
